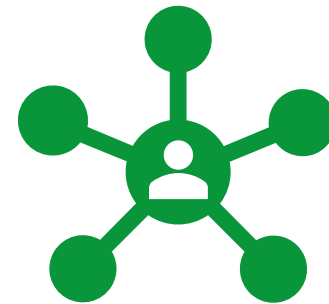

The Importance of Interfaith Dialogue



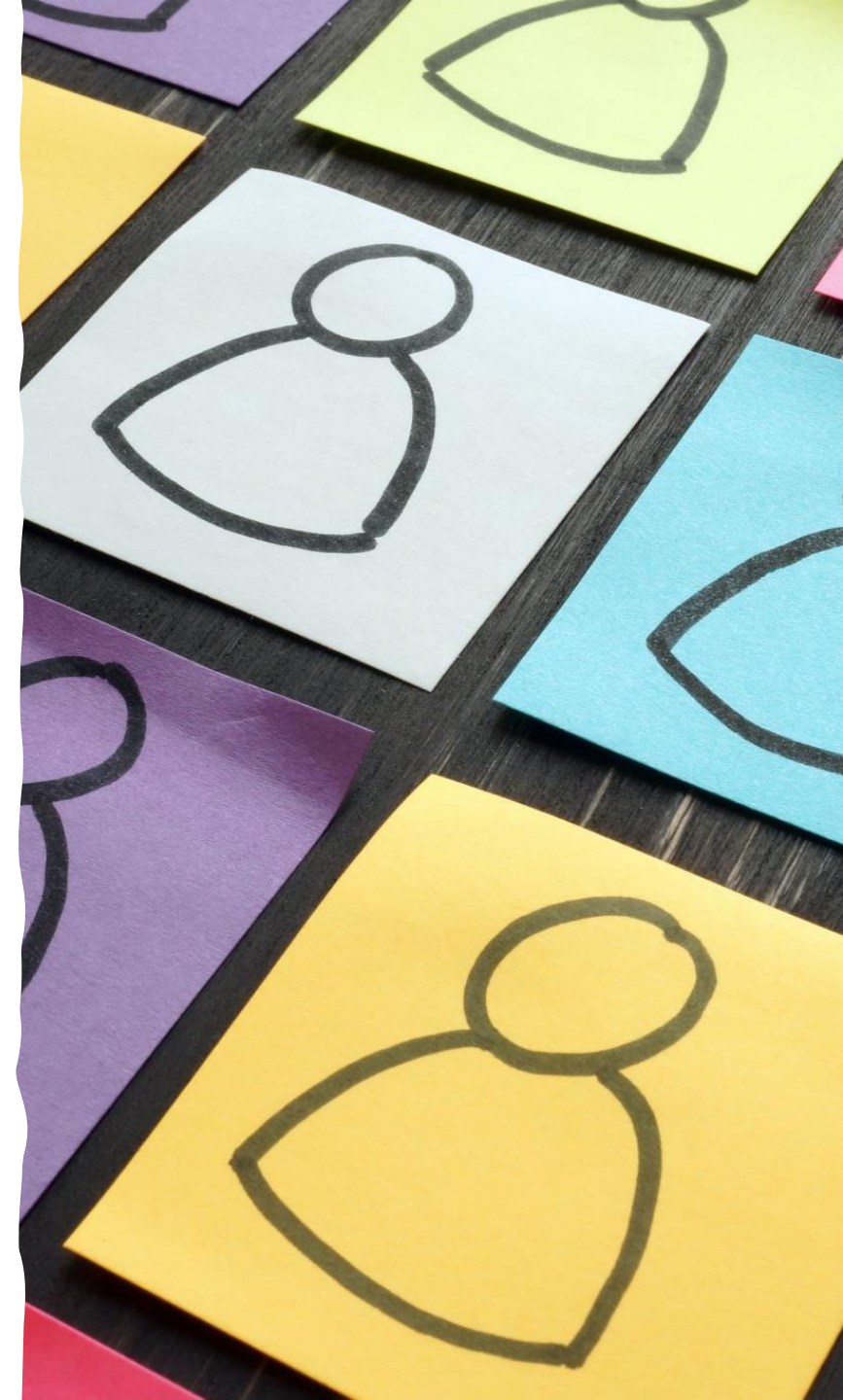

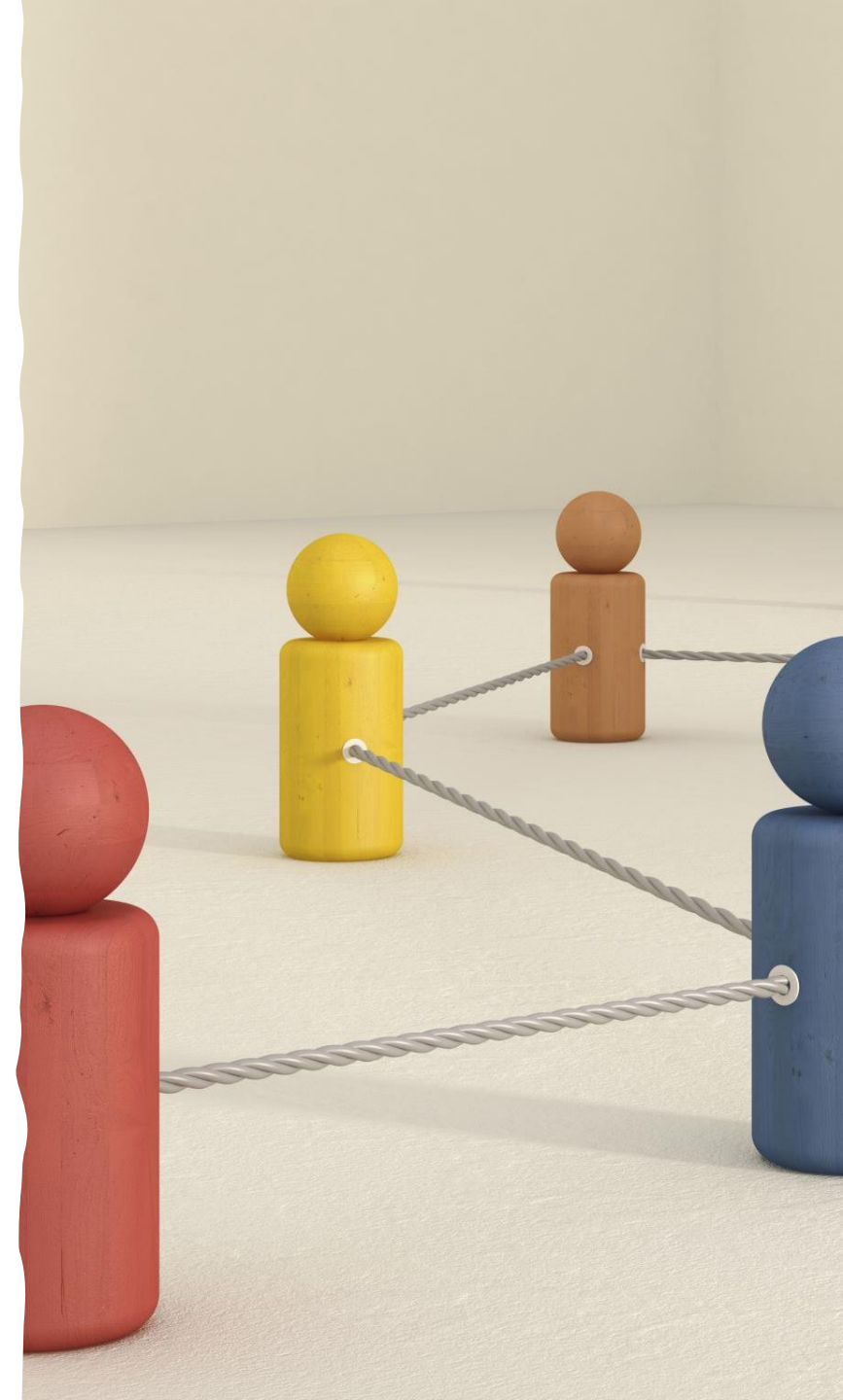
